RAPTAX



Cedar City's Recreation, Arts, and Parks Tax (commonly known as the RAP tax), is a 0.1% local option sales tax that can be used to fund items defined by the state tax commission. Cedar City has its own ordinance directing the proceeds to be split between recreation, arts, and parks. The tax is collected from visitors and residents on sales per the state tax code and distributed to Cedar City on a monthly basis by the state tax commission. The RAP tax was re-authorized by voters in 2013 and has been active in our community for 16 fiscal years. Voters are required to re-authorize the tax every 10 years and will see it on the November 2023 General Election ballot to re-authorize the existing tax with no changes.


